 Author: Rev. Thomas Dubay, S.M.
 Description: Subtitled "Science and Theology Meet," this book explores the intricate beauty of our world which scientific tools have allowed us to explore with greater detail and that the created world reflects the Mind of its Creator.

 Description: ~~This book, penned by one of the most famous philosophical atheists of the 20th century, chronicles the author's movement from atheism to belief in God.~~

 Description: ~~The author is the director of the National Institutes of Health (NIH) and led the Human Genome Project. He demonstrates that our understanding of physics, chemistry and biology all point to the existence of the God of the Holy Bible.~~
