Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

A reminder that I will be out of town from next Monday, January 25th through Friday, January 29th. **There will NOT be a morning Mass on January 25th, but we WILL have morning Mass Tuesday through Friday.** Fr. Tim Furlow will be here to celebrate those Masses. I will be celebrating Mass while at home, including for Monday's intention.

We had Bible study this last week, looking at chapters 20-22 from the Book of Genesis. If you would like a recording of the class, please let me know (I already sent it out to those who normally receive these recordings).

We will be having Candlemas on Tuesday, February 2nd at 7:00pm. This will be a sung traditional Latin high Mass. You are invited to bring candles from home to have blessed at this Mass. If you are not able to come to the Mass, you can leave candles here ahead of time (with your name on them) and they will be blessed and left in the vestibule for you to pick up the next time you come to Mass. We will also bless some extra candles for people to take home. There is no need to sign up to attend this Mass.

This Saturday (tomorrow) the Latin Mass will be at 3:00pm. It will also be at 3:00pm the following Saturday (January 30th). Beginning February 6th, however, the Mass will be at 9:00am. Starting that day, confessions will be heard before Mass in the office chapel, as well as from 4:30-5:00pm before the English vigil Mass.

We are now all out of Epiphany water. The water in the dispenser (and in the bottles on the ground) will be regular holy water, blessed in the traditional rite.

Remember to let me know if you are interested in obtaining a copy of the book for the Marian consecration. They are \$9.19 on Amazon (I sent the link in a previous email this week) and I am happy to order it for you if you like. I am recommending that we read the "book" portion by April 29th (that is the first 144 pages), since that is the day we will begin the preparation for the consecration. I will be reminding people as we get closer to that date and will be explaining what exactly is done each step of the way. I will also be reminding people when we get closer to the feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus so that, if you are interested, you can plan to bring in images to be blessed for the enthronement. For those of you who already ordered the consecration book, come see me after Mass this weekend and I will give you your copy or copies.
