Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Today (New Year's Day) marks the final day of the Christmas Octave. In the modern calendar we celebrate the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God and in the traditional calendar we are celebrating the Circumcision of Our Lord. We continue to celebrate the Christmas Season through the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, though there is still a lingering sense of Christmas through Candlemas on February 2nd.

In the modern calendar, we will be celebrating the Epiphany of Our Lord this weekend, while in the traditional calendar we are celebrating it on Wednesday, January 6th. This weekend I will be blessing Epiphany chalk for people to take home and chalk their doors. We will be chalking the door of the church after the 5:00pm Saturday Vigil Mass. On Wednesday we will have the traditional Latin Mass at 7:00pm. Earlier in the day I will bless Epiphany water. This water will be available in the dispenser in the room off from the vestibule and you are free to take some home. At all the Epiphany Masses I will be chanting the Proclamation of the Movable Feasts. You can come to any of these Masses without singing up.

Remember that currently only the Sunday 9:30am Latin Mass requires scheduling. For all other Masses, including Saturday Latin Masses, First Friday and First Saturday Masses, and daily Masses in English or Latin, you do not need to sign up or tell me that you are coming – nor do you need to tell me if you are not coming. The easing of prior restrictions has made scheduling considerably easier!

From December 8th, 2020 through December 8th, 2021, we are celebrating the Year of St. Joseph. A plenary indulgence may be obtained every day during this year by saying the Litany of St. Joseph and fulfilling the other usual conditions for a plenary indulgence.
