Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

As I am sure many of you have now heard, it appears that Governor Brown is going to be implementing new restrictions throughout the state, including for places of worship. The archdiocese will be contacting parishes early next week to indicate what we will be doing. Remember that in all of this I must be obedient to the directives of the archdiocese. I know that this is extremely frustrating. My hope is that some other arrangement can be made, but even if we indeed must reduce our Mass attendance, know that I will do whatever I can to get people in to Mass more often, including celebrating additional Latin Masses on weeknights. As it stands, these restrictions are only supposed to be in place for a couple of weeks but, like you, I have learned not to be too optimistic. We will continue to do everything we can here at the parish to make sure that you are able to come to Mass frequently and receive Holy Communion and the other sacraments.

Some have asked about our veterans' clothing drive that we have had for the last couple of years in the wintertime. It seems the usual group that we work with is not receiving clothing at this time. We are in the process of choosing another organization to receive our donations. I am hoping that soon I will be able to announce the beginning of a clothing drive to help those who are most in need at this cold time of year. We will also be putting together the usual Christmas gift-giving drive if it is possible. The restrictions surrounding the coronavirus have made these things more difficult than usual, but I am sure our parish will be able to help people in need as we always have.

We had a very beautiful Mass last Tuesday at St. Patrick's Church for the formation of the Society of St. Leo the Great as an association.
