Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

I hope that everyone has had a good week. I know we are all happy that the snow is behind us (at least for this year).

If you are coming to Latin Mass tomorrow (Saturday, 2/27) remember that it will be at 3:00pm. This is because I agreed a long time ago to help at another church in the morning. The Mass will return to its 9:00am spot next week (which will be a First Saturday).

Speaking of Saturday morning Mass, I will be coming here each week from my community Holy Hour at St. Pat's and so will arrive pretty close to 9:00am. If you are interested in coming to confession, I would recommend that you wait outside in front of the main doors of the church. If you look around the corner and see that the screen door is propped open, that's the signal that confessions can begin. This will help you to stay anonymous as when I'm driving in and pulling up to the front door I won't be able to avoid seeing whoever is waiting out front.

And speaking of confessions in general, there will be music playing on the CD player in the laundry room in the office. This is to help muffle any voices coming from the chapel. Please wait on the other side of the doorway where the music is coming from so that there is enough space between you and the chapel door. If the music stops (or if I forget to start it), please go to the CD player and hit play on the remote.

Stations of the Cross will return to the normal time of 6:30pm starting next Friday.

After Stations next Friday (which is a First Friday), we will have a sung high Traditional Latin Mass at 7:00pm.

Since it is Lent, you undoubtedly are aware that we do not say or chant "Alleluia" in any of our worship. To mark the beginning of the Lenten season, we had the "burial of the Alleluia." "Alleluia," written in script and placed in a box, was buried over in the grass (there is a cross to mark the spot). At the Easter Vigil, the "Alleluia" will be dug up and proclaimed.

Also during Lent we are celebrating 40 Days for Life. During this time, every Monday through Saturday from 7:00am to 7:00pm, a vigil takes place in front of the Planned Parenthood in Beaverton.
