

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Candles that parishioners left to be blessed Candlemas are available for pickup. There are also some extra candles that anyone is free to take that have been left on the vestibule table.

Tonight (Friday, February 5<sup>th</sup>) we will have the First Friday traditional Latin Mass at 7:00pm. We will also have a traditional Latin Mass next Friday (February 12<sup>th</sup>) at 7:00pm.

Tomorrow (Saturday, February 6<sup>th</sup>) we will have the First Saturday traditional Latin Mass at **9:00am**. We will have confessions before Mass in the chapel, but I may arrive here somewhat close to 9:00am (we have our community Holy Hour at St. Patrick's in the morning). As usual, we will begin the Mass once all confessions have been heard.

I want to thank Schola Cantus Angelorum for the beautiful chant at this week's Candlemas. I have had a number of people tell me that the Mass was especially beautiful and seemed suspended in time. Speaking for myself, I would definitely agree. We will have sung traditional Latin Masses coming up on Tuesday, February 16<sup>th</sup> at 7:00pm and Ash Wednesday, February 17<sup>th</sup> at 7:00pm. We will also have English Mass on Ash Wednesday at 9:00am.

Speaking of Ash Wednesday, some of you may have heard about some requirements coming from the Vatican regarding the distribution of ashes. Ashes will not be placed on the forehead as usual but will be sprinkled on the head. This form is already common in other countries and is actually an ancient manner of receiving ashes. Clerics, in particular, according to tradition place the ashes on their tonsure, and the practice of distributing ashes to the laity in this manner has existed for a long time. In any event, we can hope that next year at this time we will be back to receiving ashes in the manner to which we are accustomed.

Please feel free to take a copy of the Magnificat Lenten Companion from the table in the vestibule. These booklets contain a nice meditation for each day during Lent following the English Mass lectionary.

We will be having Stations of the Cross on Fridays during Lent. Unfortunately, we won't be able to have the usual meal together afterwards. More details will be provided next week.

Sarah Faux, our organist, has started a group which sings English Vespers every Friday evening at 7:00pm over Zoom. If you would like to be a part of this, email Sarah at sjarvinen2000@yahoo.com for more info and for the Zoom link. Log on ten minutes early for a crash course on singing vespers. And you don't need to sing along to participate (though you are welcome to) – you can simply log on and pray!
