Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Praised be Jesus Christ!

We had a great turnout for all of the events here last Sunday. Confessions went for over two hours and we had the largest gathering yet for Adoration and for the procession. It seems that more and more people are finding out about what is taking place here each Sunday and are coming to spend time with Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and to ask His blessing upon ourselves, our Church and our world. We will be continuing with the same schedule this Sunday with Adoration from 9:00am to 11:00am, confessions from 9:30am to 11:00am and the procession at 11:00am (or whenever confessions have finished). We acquired some speakers for our chanters to use so that they can be better heard when leading the chant for the procession.

As you may remember from my last email, I am opening up the chapel to individuals and families who would like to come and spend time with Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. Just email me at jclifton@archdpdx.org or call at 503-286-3929 to set up a time. Some people took advantage of this opportunity already this last week. When you come for Adoration, I will have the chapel prepared for Exposition and you can stay as long as you like. Tuesdays through Fridays would be best, since I am taking Mondays off rather than Tuesdays during the pandemic.

A huge “thank you” to all who supported the church with contributions last Sunday or by mail. I also want to thank you for your prayers for the repose of the soul my great-aunt, Mary Rexwinkle. The family is very appreciative as well.

I wanted to make you all aware of a reconsecration of the United States to the Blessed Mother under the title of Mary, Mother of the Church that the U.S. bishops will be leading on May 1st at noon (pacific time). There is a link to more info on the website (on the page that contains all the updates). There are some other new links on the site as well, including a message from some of the priests of the archdiocese, a five-night online retreat for married couples and a petition to sign asking that any vaccine for COVID-19 will not utilize cells from aborted children. Don’t forget that there are other links at the bottom of the page for other free programs.

I thought I might also remind everyone that on our website at www.stbirgittapdx.com there is a link for Shalom Catholic television. Just click the orange button in the bottom right that says “media gallery.” And as usual, there are a variety of options to view livestreamed Masses throughout the archdiocese at <https://archdpdx.org/live-masses>, while Latin Masses can be livestreamed at www.livemass.net. As I may have mentioned before, we do not have the internet speed necessary to livestream Masses here at St. Birgitta’s, nor do we currently have internet hooked up in the church. Nevertheless, I am continuing to celebrate all Masses as usual (though not at the usual times of the day).

This week I added another page of St. Birgitta history to the website. In the coming days and weeks I will continue to add more. Even though there have been no public Masses, our volunteers have been hard at work keeping our parish going and we have been using this time in part to work on longer-term projects. When this pandemic has passed, I believe this parish will be even stronger than it was before.

Finally, I want to congratulate the Ferree family (Brandon and Philomena) on the baptism of their daughter Sharbelle Ann which took place here in the church last Friday. Dan and Sarah Fitzpatrick were the godparents. May God’s blessing be on all of them and on all of you, now and forever!
