Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Yesterday (Friday) we celebrated the Feast of the Sacred Heart. In the morning we had Mass in English and in the evening we had Mass in the traditional rite. It was a great blessing to pray two Masses in honor of Our Lord and to celebrate His great love for us!

As I mentioned before, I will be out of town next week from Monday, June 22<sup>nd</sup> until Saturday, June 27<sup>th</sup>. I will be in California for my great-aunt's funeral. I will be here for Mass on Monday morning and I will be back in time (God willing) for Mass on Saturday. All Masses will continue as usual; Fr. Tim Furlow of St. Patrick's Church will be celebrating Masses here in my absence.

Since I will be gone next week I will be sending out emails regarding Mass attendance lists early. If you are not able to come, please email me as soon as possible so that I can contact replacements before I leave. If you discover that you are not able to come to Mass later in the week, go ahead and email me anyway. When I get back I will contact people so that we can reach the limit of twenty-five people present in the church for Mass.

Morning Mass during the week has been growing in popularity. Because of concerns regarding spacing, we will likely be moving morning Mass to the church. In this case we will leave a sign on the chapel door directing people to the church.

We made an adjustment in the bulletin this week regarding our goal for collections (remember that bulletins are available on the website). We had been listing our goal at \$2,283 – an amount which had not changed for a very long time. We looked back in our records for when the amount had changed before that and we found a bulletin from nine years ago listing our goal at \$2,200. In short - as can be expected - actual weekly expenses have grown over these years. I asked the bookkeeper to calculate the correct amount, which is \$2,975. This does NOT mean that we have been in the red. In fact, we remain financially healthy thanks to the generous contributions of our parishioners and supporters. I should also mention that we here in the office are always seeking to cut down on costs to save money. Just in the last few weeks, for example, we secured a much better deal for our copy machine, paying less than we were before and getting an upgraded machine in the process as well. In the future, we will be adjusting the goal for collections in the bulletin each year beginning July 1<sup>st</sup> (the start of the fiscal year) so that we will always have the most updated amount according to our budget.

Lastly, as you undoubtedly know, Multnomah County entered "Phase 1" yesterday (Friday). While this does not change anything for us at the parish, it does mean that we are getting closer to "Phase 2." Once it seems that "Phase 2" is coming I will be updating you on changes that will affect us here. Fortunately, it will mean that more people will be able to come to Mass.
