Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

As you probably noticed, there was not a weekly message sent out last week. That’s because the priests of the archdiocese were on retreat all week. This year’s retreat was definitely unusual: we were not at Mount Angel Abbey as in years past but stayed home and listened to the talks live on the internet. Even though we were not together, we were able to maintain a retreat atmosphere. I continued to say Mass here at the church in the morning but left immediately to be in time for the talks. This year’s retreat was given by Bishop Liam Cary, who is the bishop of the Baker Diocese. He was born right here in Portland, Oregon and was ordained for the archdiocese, serving in various parish-es and roles before being named the bishop of Baker in 2012. His talks were inspiring and helpful to us priests who are ministering in such strange and difficult times. As great as the retreat was, I hope that next year we are all able to be down at the abbey together.

As you have probably heard, some of the counties have moved into “phase 2” of the Coronavirus response. Unfortunately, this does not include Multnomah County. It appears that we may be entering into “phase 1” soon, though that will not change anything for us here at the church. Once we enter into “phase 2” there will be some marked differences that I will be telling you about as soon as we know when it will be initialized. In the meantime, I have to keep making the schedules as usual. I cannot wait until I don’t need to make the schedules anymore! We have more and more people signing up – which is great – but that means that the time to make it through the rotation is growing. For those of you who have been coming to the less attended weekend Masses and had been able to go just about every week, you’ll probably notice that you’ll be on the list less often than before. As usual, our daily morning English Masses do not begin to approach 25 people, so if you ever want to come to Mass at 9:00am any day Monday through Friday, just let me know and I can guarantee you a spot.

I’ll likely send out a message again in a couple of days since I’ve been catching up here in the office and want to get into the usual routine of Friday/Saturday messages and bulletins. I’ve managed to get through most of the emails, but I still have some calls to return. It looks like I may be caught up by the end of the day!
