

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Looking at the news, it seems we may still be out a way from entering Phase 2. Overall, though, it seems our scheduling has been working out well and people have been able to get to Mass regularly. I am hoping that the new method of rotation will run smoothly and will cut down on the time it takes to make the schedule. Remember that letting me know if you cannot come to Mass as soon as possible also makes the process easier.

I want to ask for your prayers for some parishioners of ours: the Felt family (parents are Jeremy and Ashley). They have been in Florida where some extended family members have been sickened by the Coronavirus. One family member, Ashley's uncle, has passed away. In your charity please pray for the repose of the soul of John Vazoulas and for the recovery all afflicted. I received word that Ashley's grandmother has been sent home from the hospital while other family members are still awaiting results from their tests. As time passes, I know that more and more of us will know of people who have been sickened by the Coronavirus. A priest I knew when I was in the seminary (Fr. Vincent Bui) passed away from Coronavirus a few weeks ago (please pray for him as well). I hope that all of our parishioners – especially our older parishioners or people with weakened immune systems – do all they can to keep safe.

I want to thank everyone again for the contributions that have been coming, either by mail or in the basket. I know that some of you are not able to come to Mass and it has meant a lot that you have continued to offer support. As you may know, the word “church” (ecclesia) refers first to people and secondly to the building. No matter how far we are spread out, we are one in Christ.

I should also mention that I have received an update from the Archdiocese regarding the annual appeal and it seems we're only about a thousand dollars away from our goal. Since we are so close, I thought I would just leave some more envelopes on the table in the vestibule. If you want to support the appeal by mail, you can send a check that says “Archbishop's Catholic Appeal” in the memo line. We are all very blessed in Archbishop Sample and your prayers and support go a long way in helping the Church in Western Oregon.

Lastly, we had a First Communion Mass for Madeline Kosel last Saturday and we will have First Communion for Aloysius Gonzales a week from this Sunday. These two celebrations mark the last First Communions for children this year. Once the pandemic is over, we will have a special celebration for all of this year's First Communicants. Congratulations to our First Communicants and their families!
