

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

There are a lot of important announcements this week, so this might be a longer message than usual. First and foremost, I would like to extend my deepest gratitude to our parishioners for coming to the aid of the Kosels, who lost their home in the recent wildfires. We will be leaving the “parish assistance fund” jar out for two more weekends. You may certainly continue to donate after that, but make sure that your check (on the memo line) or your envelope says “Parish Assistance Fund – Kosels.” That way we will know that it is not for our general parish assistance fund, which helps parishioners in general who are in special need. If you are interested in donating any goods or services, please call or email the parish office and we will forward your information to the Kosels. This is preferable to contacting the Kosels directly since they are quite occupied with all that they have to get done at this time.

We will begin catechism signups for First Holy Communion and Confirmation. If you are interested in enrolling any of your children for catechism, please sign up on the form in the vestibule (or, if you think you might not be up in the Mass rotation for a bit, just send me an email).

Starting the first Saturday of October (October 3rd) we will be moving the Saturday 4:00pm English Vigil Mass back to its pre-pandemic time of 5:00pm. By returning to the original schedule we are ensuring that there will be ample time for confessions in the hall and for Mass to start on time. For now the Saturday Latin Mass will stay at 3:00pm. To be clear, the Saturday English Vigil Mass this Saturday (September 26th) will be at **4:00pm** but starting Saturday October 3rd the Mass will be moving to its original time of **5:00pm**.

Another return to pre-pandemic practice is that we have moved the Monday through Friday morning English Mass back to the chapel. With colder weather approaching, it will be easier to heat up the smaller chapel. We will leave signs on the door of the main church throughout next week to remind people. At least for now the time for the weekday English Mass will remain at 9:00am.

As you heard in yesterday’s email, we will be restarting our Bible study of the Book of Genesis again soon. Our first classes will take place on October 7th and 8th. Call or email me if you have any questions or if you would like audio copies of the classes thus far.

With great joy we congratulate Stephen and Jessica Robinson on the birth of their new baby boy! Peter James Robinson was born on September 16th at 7:28am and weighed in at 7 lbs. 12 oz. Congratulations also to Gretchen Robinson who is now a grandmother and Chuck and Peggy Schumacher who are now great-grandparents!

On Saturday, October 17th Archbishop Sample is asking us to pray the Rosary at 11:00am for peace in our cities and towns. The Archbishop will be leading a Eucharistic procession in Portland. I will post more information as it becomes available.

I want to thank everyone for their help with wiping down the pews after Mass. If you have visited other churches you may notice that they do not do this. This is because these churches have a crew of volunteers that comes in after each Mass to wipe everything down. Since we are a smaller operation here at St. Birgitta’s, it made sense to simply have everyone wipe down their own area. I know that our pews are taking a licking as a result, but we will make sure to treat and restore them once the pandemic is over.
